Targeted Participation Projects

Throughout July and August this year, the Zone supported Central Southland Netball Centre and Upper Clutha Netball Centre to run programmes to grow participation.

Central Southland ran a Netty fest that was highly successful in attendance with a great turnout of boys and girls participating. With growth on last year, they had 41 teams enter from years 5-8.

Upper Clutha ran a junior umpire session aimed at beginner umpires (school aged and adults), to gain confidence and learn the basics of umpiring whilst increasing participation in umpiring and impacting growth of participation in the centre. They had 37 participants who had a fantastic time testing their whistles.

2025 QUARTERLY UPDATE

Year 7-8 Streaming

A balanced approach for 2026

What does this mean?

We are aiming for alignment across Centres through a "streaming" approach, sitting between random and trial-based selection methods.

How does this look?

Observe players during development sessions to assess skill level & understanding of fundamental skills

- Rank players based on these observations
- Form teams with players of similar ability levels (e.g., top 9, next 9, etc.)
- Positional balance is not a key factor, as player rotation is prioritised for development

For larger Centres:

- Rank players
- Divide into two ability groups
- Randomly assign players within those groups
- Host Centres to include a "team strength" field on registration forms to help create balanced and competitive tournament games

Congratulations Colleen!

Netball New Zealand has recognised the contribution umpiring stalwart Colleen Bond has made to the sport at an international level as she steps down from her roles with World Netball.

The long-standing umpire and umpire coach's tenure with World Netball - having spent time on the International Testing Panel and as an integral part of the International Umpire Assessment Panel - comes to an end and Bond was acknowledged at the third Test in the Taini Jamison Series in Invercargill on the 28th of August.

Bond, who was made a Member of the New Zealand Order of Merit in 2015 for her services to netball, started umpiring in the Eastern Southland Netball club competition in 1967 and went on to officiate at national championships, domestic leagues and internationally including the World Championship in Jamaica in 2003.

But it is her lasting work with aspiring umpires which sets Bond apart as she embraced her role as an umpire's coach and while her role with World Netball comes to an end, she will continue to mentor umpires in the game here.

We are so proud and thankful for the contribution Colleen has made and continues to provide for Netball and Umpires in the South Zone!
